It has been a brilliant start to the new season with the joyous 'Jeeves and Wooster', the thought provoking and beautiful 'Visitors' and the fantastic "Flint Street Nativity' entertaining our audiences. As I write this, rehearsals for our fabulous and festive Xmas Ents are taking place as well as the marvellous 'Murdered to Death which kicks off 2017 in style! As always, the standard and hard work of both onstage and off stage members in putting on these performances is highly professional and supported by a great theatre management team. We should all be very proud of our theatre!

2017 is going to be a very exciting and important year for the Nonentities. Not only have we some excellent shows still to come, (Murdered to Death, Macbeth, God of Carnage, Woman in White, One Man Two Guvnors) but we

also celebrate our 80<sup>th</sup> Birthday! To mark this, every play in the September 2017- July 2018 season will be taken from the 8 decades we have been performing. The request came through Nick Hughes, who is our Solicitor at Painters, who were the firm who did the original negotiation and legal work for the transfer to our current Rose Theatre. with Nonentities Society as the Charitable Trust to own and run it. We had about 30 visitors who all enjoyed an update from the Chairman, tours of the theatre and then their buffet which they shared with us. Thanks to Gary for providing a welcoming presence in the bar and the Committee and other members who helped. It was good to give the Youth Theatre a profile and as we had two sets of rehearsals underway our visitors saw a living working night down at the Rose.

#### THE ROSE REACHES OUT!

Links have been made with the Friends of Broadwaters Group taking the form of Social afternoons at the Rose in September and October 2016. These were organised by me, Keith Rowland, fellow "Nonny", local resident and member of Friends of Broadwaters. With the theatre being a major cultural asset not only to the town but especially within the edge of the attractive eastern gateway of Broadwaters Park, the aim is to provide an outreach opportunity for the local community to "see what happens inside the theatre" as well as forge new outward- thinking links for the its location theatre within community to both organisations future benefit.

After careful discussion with the Chairman and with the support of Debs and Mena, we decided upon an explorative first meeting in the theatre fover on the afternoon of Thursday September 22<sup>nd</sup> 2016 between 2-4pm as many of the Friends Group would be available. It proved to be a great success, and was attended by around local residents who interested to have a back-stage tour & short history of the theatre, led by Hilary Thompson, Lyn Ravenhill, Pat Gale and Carolyn Brinton.

Homemade cakes were brought along by the Friends to accompany the tea and coffee and enjoyed whilst I played Keyboard with Friends Group Chairman, Mike Abraham on guitar.

With the very positive feedback received by those who had attended on the first occasion, a further social afternoon was held on Thursday October 20<sup>th</sup> 2-4pm, With **Sue and Stephen Downing** helping host with **Debs & Mena**. Over 30 Friends

attended. **Pat Gale** gave a very amusing monologue she had written, "Honk for Jesus!" and **Lynn Ravenhill** likewise added to the laughter with a Stanley Holloway monologue delivered in best "Yorkshire brogue"! The band of local musicians had widened to include a flautist and singers, adding to the atmosphere of light hearted entertainment.

It was a great opportunity to promote the many different roles & ways local people can become involved within the theatre. We also spoke about 'Visitors'. which Lynn was busy rehearsing at the time, and also 'Flint Street Nativity', which I've recently been Musical Director for. A large group of the Friends then booked for the show and were welcomed by Anne Booth on behalf of the theatre on the night. Needless to say, they had had a great and we enjoyed а afterwards in the bar!

The 2.2 hectares of Broadwaters Park encompasses the site of the former Broadwaters Water Mill, whose restoration including replacement achieved water wheel. was substantial National Lottery funding obtained by Wyre Forest DC in partnership with the then fledgling Friends Group in the 1990's. Fund raising via many different grant sources and park events has been expertly steered and won by Jane and Mike Abraham and the members of the group who've worked very hard over the years to keep and increase the quality of the park at a time of massive local spending cuts and lack of investment. The Friends funding has paid for path resurfacing, timber bridge replacements, major lighting, additional seating, fencing, several art features, sensory garden, tree planting and glade / wildlife projects and bulb planting amongst other things.

It was through a major effort and difficult negotiation with Wyre Forest DC a couple of years back by the Friends, that the car park has remained free of charge and available for theatre audiences likewise. The council proposal had threateningly been to make it a "park and ride" / pay & display carpark or even to sell it and build on it. Fortunately at the end of the day, the Councillors agreed to reclassify it permanently as car park intrinsically for Broadwaters Park. Litter collection is part of the Friends daily voluntary care and supportive maintenance which along gardening, keeps the Green Pennant Competition awards forthcoming on an annual basis!

Our next Social Afternoon is Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> February 2017 2-4pm where it would be great to see Nonentities around in the day time enjoying a catch-up over refreshments, but also participating by way of a short monologue / sketch or song...as well as helping with the hosting.

Please let me know by 28th January if you can come along to help host or take part on 16.2.2017 or other occasions as we hope to continue with this venture on the Thursday afternoon of each month, if sufficient support. Many thanks to all who've been involved and helped so far! It's a great opportunity for promoting our theatre, keeping in touch and participating in informal entertainment - maybe trying out some short sketches / monologues you've found, written or fancy performing along with a song?!
