Here's hoping for a better year for us all!



OUR NEW WEBSITE

Hopefully by now, you will all have seen our new improved website. You may think it isn't massively different to the old one and it IS still a 'work in progress' but it does give us far more control over the content than the old one. We think that the Home Page gives a more welcoming and informative aspect to The Rose.

Ticket buying and much of the 'back pages' is still the same. However, we can now add 'News items' and upload our photos, newsletters and brochures. Images can be stored and looked back on rather than

disappearing at the end of each play.

We are hoping to introduce a secure 'Members' Site', accessible to Nonentities Society members only. Katy Ball has come on board to help with this and also to keep on top of maintaining a record of Past Productions and Cast Lists. Maybe one day ALL our fabulous photos from past productions can be archived here – anybody have a scanner and 500 spare hours??

So, how much did it cost to change? Very little! Cast your mind back to this time almost two years ago when we decided to go with the Crowdfunder (which raised almost £20,000 by the way!). We were contacted by a local web designer, Matt Cook from Blumac Digital; he had seen our campaign -and our old web site!- and kindly offered to help design a new one – FREE OF CHARGE. The offer was too good to refuse and Bob and I, with assistance from Andy Bingham and David Wakeman, set the ball rolling. After several meetings and LOTS of emails and phone calls, we finally went live at the start of the new season. We are very grateful to Matt and his assistants for continuing to support us with this vital part of our business.

ARCHIVE PHOTOS

Photo Opportunities!

What should we do with all the lovely publicity photos that Colin Hill takes? The reality is that they come down from the boards and end up in piles and folders in the office waiting for Mary Poppins to click her fingers and they'd be sorted!

All the photos after 2017 are digitally stored so, should we need access to them we have it, therefore the committee decided that these left over should be released to members, and have been sorted into blue folders in a large plastic box on a small table in the foyer. If you are at rehearsals or pop into the theatre for any reason, you can have a rummage and take what you will. They will be available until April 3rd, after which the photos will be 'recycled'.

The plan in future is to keep one or two photos - director's choice, together with the programme for that show - in a manageable folder. We have been talking for years about how best to store or archive the older photos, programmes and memorabilia and, as with many projects, this is a 'work in progress'. It's an important part of our history. Several members have done a sterling job in sorting and labelling many years' worth of items which are currently housed in the props room, and there is a lovely display of black and white framed photos in the dressing room area. If we could ever find a volunteer with the time, knowledge and equipment to scan and store the photos digitally that would be a bonus. Maybe there is a Mary Poppins archiver out there....???

LIGHTING AND SOUND NEED YOUR HELP

I know you have heard this before, but we are desperately short of technicians for Lighting and Sound. If anyone is interested in helping, please let me know as soon as possible. If you have not done this before, then training can be provided. Even if you have very modest technical experience, it is still very easy to operate either Lighting or Sound for the week of a show, whilst the preparation and programming can be set up beforehand with one of our more experienced members. You need to be available for the performances plus dress rehearsals on the previous Sunday and the rehearsals during the final week. We have thousands of items of clothing all now arranged neatly and organised after our major tidy up and refit of a couple of years ago including daleks, frogs, crows, reindeer and even

Despite this vast collection we still make and source new collections each season, such as our beautiful dresses for Cranford designed and made by Jenny and with the help of some sewing elves. Also, one off specialities including half lady half man for Hound of the Baskervilles and 15 identical clown outfits for Oh What a Lovely War.

A recent challenge was how to make a white wedding dress for Geraldine in Vicar of Dibley look like she'd been splashed by a muddy puddle in a matter of 10 seconds. This called for a second identical dress and a lot of fun painting and spraying black acrylic paint about.

Whether it's turning boys into mice, quick changes in the wings or copying instantly recognisable characters, wardrobe is a fun place to play, so why not give us a go?

BAR MANAGER:

New Year Update by Alan Booth

I'm not quite sure how I ended up as Bar Manager - I do admit to having an interest in alcoholic beverages and have sampled a few in my time. I had found it a pleasant way to spend an evening serving audiences and chatting about theatre and drink, so I thought I'd give it a go. Jane Holt had done a sterling job co-ordinating both Front of House and Bar and it was time to spread the workload so here I am!

I am pleased to report that the bar is operating well so far this season and that we have a good group of volunteers which has enabled us to staff all the required nights. Anne and I have trained up several new volunteers and we have introduced a system of Steward 1 and Steward 2 so that people who do not feel confident about opening up, reconciling the cash and locking up at the end of an evening can still work behind the bar as Steward 2 – this appears to be working well. I would like to thank Anne for compiling the bar rota and introducing a bar staff WhatsApp group. It's not all about serving on the night - I would also like to thank Keith Rowland who has volunteered to come in and stock the shelves and clean the bar in the week prior to any performances.

A few changes have been made - a new bottle chiller and a new sink have been added. In an attempt to be more Eco-Friendly, we have introduced the use of re-usable plastic glasses which can be taken into the auditorium and then collected in bins at the end of the show and washed in the glass washer. The big challenge is making sure people put the glasses in the correct bins and returning them to the bar at the end of the show – we have lost a few, but we're getting there! In the New Year we will be looking at introducing spirits on optics for whisky and gin (maybe plain and pink) and also providing small bottles of Prosecco.

The bar is an important cash generator for the theatre, and I would like to thank the great support of all our volunteers who make the operation of the bar possible. Visiting companies such as KODS and the various Pro-shows that hire our theatre, all need the services of the bar and Front of House so it is important that all members should support these roles if they can.



Our members really enjoyed bringing such zany characters to life and getting to have fun playing up for the stage.

Next up was our Christmas show, Five Children and It. Adapted from the beloved children's book, a group of siblings are evacuated and meet a mysterious creature who can grant wishes. Our cast talked directly to the audience to tell this story, breaking the fourth wall, and this style of dialogue added a real sense of mischief and adventure to the tale. We enjoyed bringing the wishes to life, with memorable moments including seeing the Psammead in full costume and our Junior Company portraying a care-home full of old biddies on a

day trip. The show was a real success and we'd like to congratulate the cast on their hard work.




KRYPTfest 2022: Comedy and Tragedy


KRYPTfest 2023: Jumping through Genres!




